



## ■ Needle Syringe Program (NSP)

The NSP is a service of the Health Unit and the community for local injection drug users (IDUs). It provides sites where new supplies (needles, sharps containers, and other safer injection equipment) can be obtained and used needles are returned. Information is also available about other community services.

### Program Benefits

#### To the Injection Drug User:

- Promotes the single use of injection drug use equipment and therefore, less chance of contracting a blood borne infection like HIV, hepatitis B or hepatitis C.
- Positive contact with the community and a potential source of help or referral to other community services.

#### To the Community:

- Safe disposal of used needles.
- Reduced incidents of blood borne infections in the community.

## ■ Overdose Response Program

Revive is a service offered at the **6 Health Unit Smart Works sites and 3 Change Health Care sites** (listed on the back of this pamphlet). The program consists of both Overdose Prevention Training and the distribution of Nasal Spray Narcan (naloxone) Kits.

**To be eligible for Revive training, clients must be**

- are currently dependent on opioids,
  - have a history of opioid dependence
- and**
- have family or friends of those who are currently using or have a history of use

People can come to any of the Health Unit sites and Change Health Care sites to receive this life saving training from a Registered Nurse.

Naloxone is a lifesaving drug that works only in the case where the overdose is caused by opioids such as morphine, oxycodone and heroin. Overdose deaths from opioids kill as many people in Ontario every year as car crashes.

## ■ Safer Inhalation Program

SIP is a new service offered by the Smart Works Program.

Safer Inhalation programs supply new equipment to people who smoke drugs, preventing open wounds and burns as well as decreasing sharing, resulting in possible decreased transmission of Hepatitis C and HIV in the community.

Through the SIP, people have access to safer inhalation kits that include stems, screens, mouthpieces, chop sticks, condoms and pamphlet resources.

Smart Works sites accept returns of used safer inhalation equipment. SIP is offered at all participating Smartworks sites.

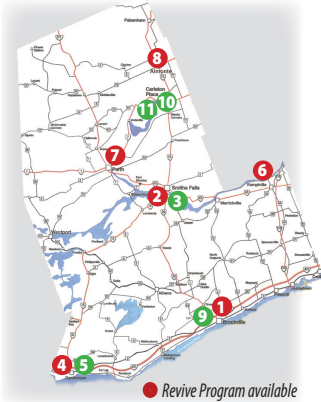
