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Will your 3-year-old be ready to start school in one year

Many parents look at their 3-year-old children and say “I can’t believe he/she will be starting school in a year”. They wonder if their child will be able to adapt to the structure and routines of the classroom and being away from their parent(s) for the whole day.

Thinking about your preschoolers’ school readiness well before he/she is registered gives you a wonderful opportunity to look at their skills and development and then help them learn and practice skills that will help them when they start school.

Questions to ask yourself are, can your 3-year-old:

- Get dressed with help
- Go to the bathroom
- Ask for help
- Feel good about trying new things
- Share & take turns with other children
- Communicate so a teacher and other students can understand
- Listen and follow directions

The Health Unit can provide you with a developmental checklist for your 3-year-old so that you can see if your child is able to do the activities that most children the same age are doing.
